### Vocabulary of the week

<b>commute</b>	<i>verb</i>	to travel some distance from house to the workplace <i>I <b>commute</b> everyday by bus.</i>
<b>abroad</b>	<i>adverb</i>	in or to a foreign country <i>He's currently <b>abroad</b> on business.</i>
<b>unreliable</b>	<i>adjective</i>	not able to be trusted or believed <i>Public transportation in Jakarta can be <b>unreliable</b>.</i>
<b>couldn't agree more</b>	<i>expression</i>	to strongly agree <i>Kiky says it's the government's fault, and I <b>couldn't agree more</b>.</i>
<b>baffling</b>	<i>adjective</i>	impossible for someone to understand or explain <i>The bus network in Jakarta is <b>baffling</b> even for the locals</i>
<b>go against</b>	<i>phrasal verb</i>	to go the opposite of something; to not agree with (something) <i>The motorcycles <b>go against</b> the flow of traffic.</i>
<b>in a rush</b>	<i>expression</i>	to say that someone needs to do something urgently or quickly <i>Commuters are always <b>in a rush</b> to get to the office.</i>
<b>break down</b>	<i>phrasal verb</i>	stops working (machine or vehicle) <i>Our car <b>broke down</b> and we had to push it off the road.</i>
<b>viciously</b>	<i>adverb</i>	in a violent or aggressive way <i>Women passengers <b>viciously</b> entered the train to get a seat.</i>
