worn out	<i>adjective</i>	can no longer be used because it is old <i>My jeans are almost worn out because I've worn them so much.</i>
come up	<i>phrasal verb</i>	to move towards someone <i>A young girl came up to me and asked for money.</i>
on-trend	<i>adjective</i>	in keeping with the latest trend, fashion, story, etc. <i>The whole ethical jewelry vibe is very on-trend.</i>
tardiness	<i>noun</i>	the quality of being late or slow <i>Tardiness will not be tolerated in this office.</i>
