| spendthrift | <i>adjective</i> | spending money in an irresponsible way <i>He struggles to support his family because he's a spendthrift.</i> |
| thrifty | <i>adjective</i> | showing a careful use of money <i>They have plenty of money now, but they still tend to be thrifty.</i> |
| take advantage of something | <i>phrasal verb</i> | to use the good things in a situation <i>We should completely take advantage of all this good deal!</i> |
| cash | <i>noun</i> | money in the form of notes and coins <i>Will you pay by credit card or in cash?</i> |
| cashless | <i>adjective</i> | paying using credit card, debit card, or other electronic system <i>With the rise of e-money, people are becoming cashless.</i> |
| hassle | <i>noun</i> | a situation causing difficulty or trouble <i>Using cash can be a hassle for some people.</i> |
| spend | <i>verb</i> | to give money as a payment for something <i>She spends a lot of money on clothes.</i> |
| compulsive | <i>adjective</i> | doing something a lot and unable to stop doing it <i>I might be a compulsive shopper, and this is dangerous.</i> |
| impulsive | <i>adjective</i> | doing something without planning or consideration; spontaneous <i>He's an impulsive shopper. He buys things he doesn't need.</i> |
| street vendor | <i>noun</i> | someone who sells food or other good in the street <i>I love buying food off street vendors.</i> |
