Vocabulary of the week

prepare	<i>verb</i>	to make or get something or someone ready for the future <i>Lita will prepare Kiky's dinner at 6 PM.</i>
opportunity	<i>noun</i>	a set of chances that makes it possible to do something <i>Taking the TOEIC can open working opportunities for me.</i>
proficiency	<i>noun</i>	a high degree of competence or skill; expertise <i>TOEIC, TOEFL, or IELTS tests your English proficiency.</i>
required	<i>adjective</i>	officially considered compulsory, essential, or a must <i>Foreign students are normally required to take TOEFL or IELTS.</i>
requirement	<i>noun</i>	something that you must do, or something you need <i>A good degree is a minimum requirement for many jobs.</i>
abroad	<i>adverb</i>	in or to a foreign country <i>She's going abroad to the UK to continue her studies.</i>
wink	<i>verb</i>	to close and open one eye quickly, usually as a signal, joke, etc. <i>I thought he was being serious until he winked at me.</i>
comfortable	<i>adjective</i>	relaxed; not worried <i>I'm not comfortable with the idea of my child studying abroad.</i>
fluent	<i>adjective</i>	can speak a language easily, well, and quickly <i>I'm learning English to be more fluent in the language.</i>
