### Vocabulary of the week

<b>decisive</b>	<i>adjective</i>	to be able to make decisions quickly and confidently <i>As a leader, you must be <b>decisive</b> in making decisions.</i>
<b>indecisive</b>	<i>adjective</i>	opposite of decisive; not able to make decisions quickly <i>My boss is completely useless. He's such an <b>indecisive</b> leader.</i>
<b>decision</b>	<i>noun</i>	a choice that you make about something <i>She has to make some very difficult <b>decisions</b> for her business.</i>
<b>excitement</b>	<i>noun</i>	a feeling of extreme happiness and enthusiasm <i>If you want <b>excitement</b>, you should try parachuting.</i>
<b>bother</b>	<i>verb</i>	to annoy or cause problems for someone <i>Don't <b>bother</b> me when I'm working.</i>
<b>bring out the best in</b>	<i>verb; idiom</i>	to say that a person or thing helps show someone best qualities <i>His wife certainly <b>brings out the best and the worst in</b> him.</i>
<b>drawback</b>	<i>noun</i>	a disadvantage or negative part of a situation <i>One of the <b>drawbacks</b> of living here is the rats!</i>
<b>make up your mind</b>	<i>verb; idiom</i>	to decide <i>I haven't <b>made up my mind</b> which car to buy.</i>
<b>rely on</b>	<i>phrasal verb</i>	to need someone or something for support, help, etc. <i>My mother <b>relied on</b> me for financial support.</i>
